DLD is used when there are problems using/understanding language. It is not used when issues occur with autism, brain injuries, or genetic disorders.






The outdated terminology of 'mixed expressive-receptive disorder' is still in use for insurance purposes.

DLD co-occurs with reading/writing disorders about 50% of the time and is often hard to identify in short or casual encounters.
